

ROLLINS PASS - ROBBERS ROOST

BERTHOUD PASS - MARY JANE SKI AREA

Robbers Roost: Robbers Roost is a camp ground on the West slope of Berthoud Pass. It is about five miles past the top of the pass as you drive towards Winter Park. It sits at an elevation of about 10,000 feet and is productive from July to the first snow which is usually early in September. There are several other campgrounds and picnic grounds further along US40, near Winter Park, that are productive.

Rollins Pass: Another area to look for mushrooms is just East of Winter Park. Take the Rollins pass road that is located just across from the West Portal of the Moffit railroad tunnel. The road follows the old railroad bed over Rollins Pass from Winter Park to Rollinsville. It is an easy road for cars. Look on the North slopes and near streams. Please note that at the time this book was printed, the Arrow Tunnel on the Rollins Pass road was closed because of a collapse, so it wasn't possible to drive all the way to Rollinsville from Winter Park.

Mary Jane Ski Area: There are usually mushrooms at the bottom of the Mary Jane Ski area even in a dry season. You will see a sign for the ski area on the left as you drive West towards Winter Park. Keep your eyes open on both sides of the road for *Boletus*. Check seepage areas below the road for *Hydnum imbricatum* and other unusual fungi.
